The Careers Department

Our department is situated on the first floor in Bede House and is open Monday to Friday 8.30am to 4.30pm (Term time only). Our team of 3 professionally qualified Careers Advisers plus a Work Experience Coordinator work with students to provide comprehensive bespoke careers information, advice and guidance. We aim to raise their aspirations and their awareness of the range of options and opportunities available, enabling them to become effective decision makers and to plan for their future careers.

Year 11 Careers Programme

One important aspect of Year 11 is making applications for Post-16 choices, whether they are considering moving on to Sixth Form, starting a course at college or beginning their employment journey through an apprenticeship.

During Year 11 students will receive advice and guidance from the Careers Department to help them make informed decisions about their Post-16 Destination.

We will initially meet students during a form group registration in the Autumn term to provide a detailed overview of available options which will be followed up . All students will then have an individual guidance meetings during the Spring term and parents and carers are welcome to attend this meeting.

Students will have assemblies focussed on decision making and post 16 options. Students will receive information on a wide range of careers through our career of the month tutorials. Students are invited to lunch time industry insight talks that we hold throughout the year.

Work Experience

In addition to the in-person work experience that takes place in the Summer term, students are encouraged to engage with Virtual Work Experience. These live and on- demand opportunities, give students access to professionals working with some of the UK's largest companies and provide insights into careers they hadn't thought of. Students will be made aware of appropriate opportunities. We communicate these via <u>our school website</u> and through our newsletters.

Students are welcome to visit the Careers department during break time and lunchtime, careers staff will be on hand to offer advice and guidance.

Year 11

One important aspect of Year 11 is making applications for your Post-16 choices, whether you are considering moving on to Sixth Form, starting a course at college or beginning your employment journey through an apprenticeship.

The Careers Department team look forward to working closely with you during Year 11 to support you in planning the best transition for you. We will meet with you first within form group registration in the Autumn term to provide a more detailed overview of your available options which will be followed up by individual guidance meetings during the Spring term to give you the opportunity to explore your own preferences in greater detail. You may have specific questions regarding courses, entry qualifications, transport, progression after courses, work experience or the applications process and we will be happy to help you discover the answers.

Associated Sixth Form

Studying A Levels and Level 3 Applied Courses in the Associated Sixth Form enables you to continue your GCSE subjects in greater depth and/or discover new subjects that are only offered after Year 11. You will be taken through the application process in school which will cover subject information. However, in advance you can look at the prospectus on the <u>St. Aidan's website</u> for course content and entry requirements and watch the subject videos for a brief course overview.

Further Education Colleges

Some colleges offer a range of A Level subjects such as York College and Leeds City College, however all offer vocational and practical courses. These are related to a broad employment area such as business, engineering, IT and health and social care and provide the opportunity to gain relevant qualifications and train for a specific career. If you are considering making an application to college it is important to research courses and entry requirements on individual college websites and sign up to attend open/taster days which will take place in the Autumn.
