
Itineraries: Departures (July 6th-13th)


Ardeche Day activities


- 2 day two-person kayak descent of the Ardeche Gorge

Medication

- T shirts not vests for canoeing (sunburn)

- Hat/cap
- Water bottle
- Cord for glasses (old sunglasses)
- No denim or vests for watersports
- Insect repellent (Bivvie out)
- High Factor suncream
