

What to do before the exam each day



Register in your normal form room (no assemblies) – then to 'bag drop' (old PE2).

Go to the loo!

Arrive on time, 15 mins prior to the start; exams start at 09:15 and 13:30.

But if you are late go to Reception to sign in then straight to the exam hall.

Equipment



Bring the right exam equipment, e.g. black pen, pencil, ruler, calculator (if applicable for subject) etc.

Pencil cases must be see through, as should water bottles (with labels removed).

Neither mobile phones nor watches are permitted in the exam hall.



Uniform



You must be in full school uniform, including your lanyard.

Make sure your pockets are empty.






When you arrive at the exam hall



- Check your seat number (outside CGH, Exams office)
- Queue up outside CGH/go to your room
- Sit in the right seat eg A5, J15





During the exam



- There must be absolutely no communication between students*
- You must not have a phone or a watch with you
- Digital and analogue clocks will be in all the exam rooms
- Listen very carefully to the instructions at the start of the exam
- Check you have the correct exam paper in front of you
- If you have a question or need help, raise your hand

The rules!

Warning to candidates

















You must be on time for all your examinations.

Possession of a mobile phone or other unauthorised material is not allowed even if you do not intend to use it. You will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification from the exam/qualification.

You must not talk to, attempt to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the examination room.

You must follow the instructions of the invigilator.

You must not sit an examination in the name of another candidate.

You must not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.

If you are confused about anything, only speak to an invigilator.

The Warning to candidates must be displayed in a prominent place outside each examination room. This may be a hard copy A3 paper version or an image of the poster projected onto a wall or screen for all candidates to see.



At the end of the exam



Wait in silence when the exam finishes until you are told to leave.

Leave in absolute silence when you are instructed to do so and remain silent until you are well away from the exam hall.

Return to normal lessons unless you are told otherwise.
