Year 10 Geography GCSE Fieldwork to Leeds, Thursday 27th March 2025

On Thursday 27th March 2025 our Year 10 Geographers will be undertaking a Geography fieldwork day to Leeds. The fieldwork undertaken is essential for students who are studying GCSE Geography as they will sit an exam on the work they do in the field.

Pupils will depart after registration on Thursday 27th March 2025 and travel to and from Leeds by coach and will return in time for the school buses.

In Leeds the students will pay a visit to the new climate innovation development to support their understanding of urban sustainability. They will also visit a variety of sites, including Leeds Trinity and Leeds Dock, which have undergone urban regeneration; their fieldwork will centre around the success of these projects.

Some of the fieldwork carried out involves the students working near their teacher, but not under direct supervision. They will be asked to carry out some basic surveys including sketches and land use maps.

Pupils must wear sensible clothes for the day. They should ensure they are comfortable and appropriately dressed. Footwear that is suitable to walk a good distance around the city is also essential, along with a warm jumper and a waterproof jacket as students will be outside all day. A mobile phone, if they have one, is useful for safety and fieldwork purposes, but students should use the devices appropriately whilst on this school trip and it is their responsibility to keep the phone safe. Please note that any electronic devices are not covered by our school insurance.


Students will need to bring a bottle of water and a packed lunch. There may be an opportunity to buy a drink or snack later in the day and students are invited to bring a small amount of money to account for this if they wish. We request that packed lunches and snacks must not contain nuts.

We are asking you to make a voluntary contribution of £9.50 by Friday 28th February, towards the cost of the trip, the item will be available on your Parentpay account now.

Consent for the trip is required on ParentPay and by ticking the box on ParentPay you are agreeing to your child taking part on the trip, the cost and confirming that your child's medical details are up to date. If there are any changes to your child's medical details please update these via the Arbor parent app or email medicalroom@staidans.co.uk.

If your child's medical details indicate that they need medication such as inhalers or antihistamines, please ensure that they bring them on the trip, otherwise we will be unable to take them. If they no longer require this medication, please advise the medical room in advance of the trip.
